COVID-19 Update

The following are extracts from our MP Jeremy Hunt's constituency newsletter of Thursday 18th February and Monday 15th February. Though rates are still high, it is very encouraging news, but we must not drop our guard. Many of us will now have received the first vaccine but we must continue with the lockdown restrictions until things are really under control.

"There have been **5,589** confirmed cases in Waverley and sadly **237** confirmed deaths, with an estimated **224** active cases in Waverley, significantly down on last week." This data was accurate as of 11am, Thursday 18th February.

"The R Number has fallen below 1 in the UK for the first time since July. According to SAGE, it is estimated to be between 0.7 and 0.9. This is brilliant news and means – bluntly – that lockdown and vaccinations are working. More specifically, in the last 7 days coronavirus cases are down 28%, hospital admissions were down 26.5% and deaths across England were down 25.5%". This data was accurate as of 11am, Monday 15th February.

Whatever your political leaning, I am sure that you will all join me in wishing Jeremy well following his fall where he badly broke his arm. He has now had the necessary surgery to fix what was a complicated fracture.

Vaccination scams

Please continue to beware of vaccination scams. When it is your turn for vaccination, you will receive a call or letter from the NHS who will never ask for money or bank details.

Pavilion and playground maintenance

We have decided to take advantage of the Covid lockdown and have the pavilion decorated and to have a major overhaul of the zip wire in the playground. The pavilion is

of course currently closed so no-one will be inconvenienced by the redecoration. There will be no need to close the playground whilst the zip wire is being overhauled as the manufacturers will tape it off whilst the work is undertaken. Both works are scheduled to take place during March.

Please remember that the playground is operating in a Covid secure way and notices are in place.

Community Orchard

At our meeting on Wednesday 17th February the Council resolved to develop the rough piece of grassland adjoining the tennis club on the left hand side when entering the recreation ground from the main road. We shall arrange for the scrub to be cleared and the area re-turfed with a view to then planting a number of apple trees to create a small community orchard. The first phase is to get the clearance work and re-turfing done and then we can consider how best to create the orchard with involvement of the wider community.
